

- 3. Tech Orders covering equipment we may work with either at camp or on active duty if we are ever activated. We can use any of your old TO's for training.
  - 4. Organizational charts. Anything you have will be of help to us.
- 5. We now have an SCR-399 Radio to train some of our personnel on and hope to have the loan of an AN/TRC-32 if all goes well. This is not much equipment to train with at the present time but from all indications we should be authorized more equipment in the near future.
- 6. If your engineering group have any old prints, job folders or specifications of a typical AACS Navigational Aids installations we could use them for training our Engineering Section.

Should your squadron have a copy of the film "The AACS Story" we would like to use it for our next drill. Or if it can be obtained through normal supply channels we will order it.

In closing, Major Garvin and I extend our invitation to you to visit the unit in the near future. We will be happy to discuss the aforementioned problems with you.
