SUBJECT: Non-Commissioned Officers Dining-In

20 March 1969

TO: All Non-Commissioned Officers, Officers, and Honored Guests.

- 1. A "Dining-In" has been scheduled for Friday evening 18 April 1969 at The Old Country Kitchen, 10519 SE Stark Street, Portland, Oregon, from 1900 to 2230 hours.
- 2. Dress: Mess Dress with black jacket for Officers and all season blue uniform with white shirt and black bow tie for Airmen. Tuxedo or dark suit with white shirt and black bow tie are in order for civilian guests.
- 3. General Procedures: All officers of the squadron attending the Dining-In will be considered members of the mess. Since this will be conducted as a formal military affair, it is requested that the following rules of order be observed and strictly adhered to:
- a. Upon arrival the members of the mess will greet the President of the Mess and Honored Guests.
- b. Each member of the mess and guests are requested to check the master seating diagram which will be located in the front entrance to the dining room.
- c. The bar will be open from 1900 hours to 1925 hours and from 2030 hours to 2100 hours. Drinks will not be taken into the main dining room.
- d. All members of the mess and guests will assemble in the lobby of the dining room no later than five minutes before the appointed time, 1930 hours, for assembly in the main dining room.
- e. Upon arrival in the dining room, members of the mess and guests will stand behind their chairs until every person is present and will not be seated until the President of the Mess so states.
- f. Seating will be strictly according to rank and position. Place cards will be provided for each member and guest in accordance with the seating diagram. The Guest of Honor will sit to the immediate right of the President of the Mess. In NO instance will anyone begin eating until everyone is served and until the President of the Mess begins to eat.
- g. Smoking is NOT permitted from the time the members enter the Dining Room until the "Smoking Lamp" at the head table is lighted. This occurs at the beginning of the dessert course.
- h. Each time the mess is adjourned and reassembled members will stand behind their chairs until those at the head table are seated or have departed the table. Members depart the Dining-In only when the Guest of Honor has departed.

- i. At the conclusion of the guest speaker's address and closing comments by the President of the Mess, the formal activities for the evening will be terminated.
- j. At any time after the toast to the guests, a member may ask to be recognized for any appropriate reason. A typical reason may be that a toast has been forgotten. In such a case the member will stand and ask to be recognized by saying, "Mr. President, Rank and Name, I have a point of order". The President will recognize the member by calling his rank and name. The member will, in a polite and forthright manner, advise the President that a toast required by courtesy or protocol has not been proposed. The President should then request the member who has the floor to ask Mr. Vice to propose the appropriate toast.
