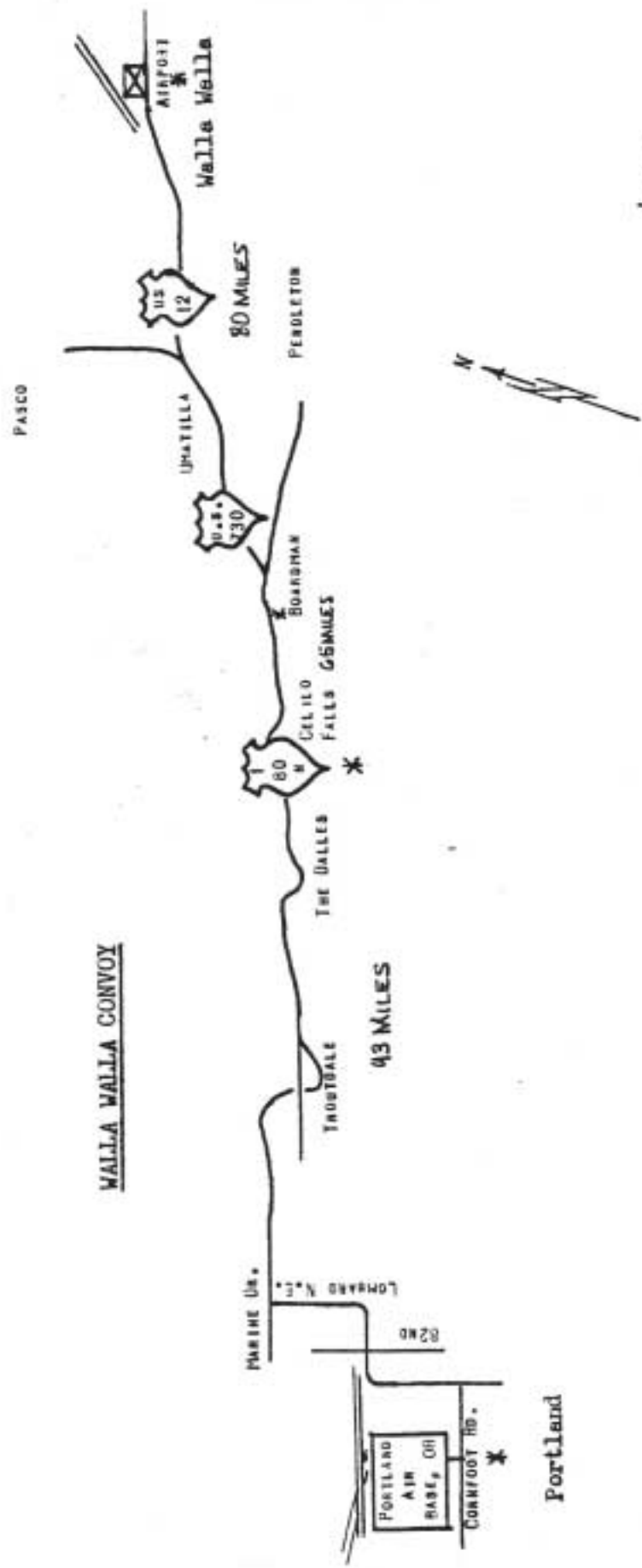

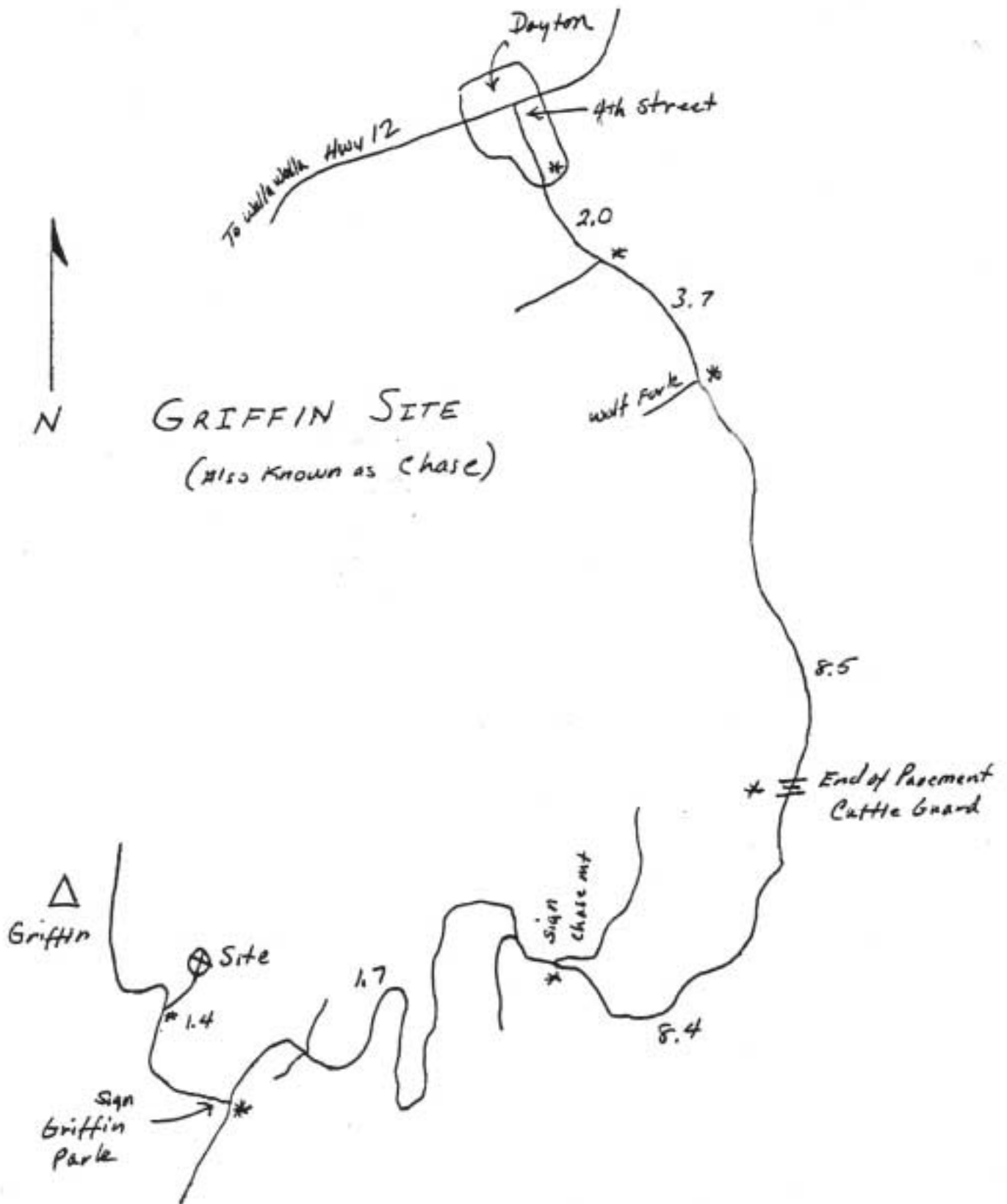

Outstanding Senior NCO Nomination (E-7 thru E-9)

1. MSG Robert H. Kehler has been selected as the 244th Combat Communications Squadron Outstanding Senior NCO for 1977 and is nominated as the Oregon Air National Guard Senior NCO of the Year.

2. MSG Kehler is assigned to the squadron's largest maintenance section, ground radio maintenance, with an authorized strength of 47 people. His leadership and training abilities have made a substantial contribution to the mission effectiveness and dependability of this our "back bone" section. As a result of his aggressive leadership, the section has provided well maintained and reliable mobile radio relay facilities to meet 'Jack Frost 77' JCS exercise requirements, 252 CMSTCG 36-hour and ORI deployments, Mt Hood National Forest fire support requirements and a vigorous recruiting display program.

3. MSG Kehler was instrumental in the development and implementation of an effective training program in response to a new training concept plan recently developed by this unit. To accomplish this task, MSG Kehler personally developed a thorough set of task breakdowns, job proficiency guides and detailed lesson plans, all of which are aimed at maximizing the training of weekend guardsmen in the limited time available. The quality of this training program has generated a high degree of enthusiasm among section personnel, particularly those in upgrade training status. As a result, improvements are already apparent in UTA attendance, involvement of weekend supervisors and trainees, personnel retention interest and in the upward flow of technically qualified personnel.

4. MSG Kehler is responsible for an innovation in the use of the AN/TRC-97 TROPO radio antenna for use in this unit's recruiting displays during the "Get Your Guard Up" campaign. He designed and implemented a method of mounting this antenna on the back of a 2½ ton truck, substantially reducing the time and effort necessary to deploy and erect the antenna. This savings of time enabled the unit to utilize the antenna as an excellent attraction during our recruiting efforts and has the further potential of improving mission effectiveness in combat communications.

5. MSG Kehler is currently active in the Pacific Northwest Council Boy Scouts of America and in the amateur radio operations field.

6. MSG Kehler combines an enthusiastic and positive attitude with the ability to identify mission goals and the adaptability to exploit new training opportunities and techniques. Since training is our primary responsibility, I can think of no better commendation. It is with great pride that I recommend he be selected as the Oregon Air National Guard Outstanding Senior NCO for 1977.
