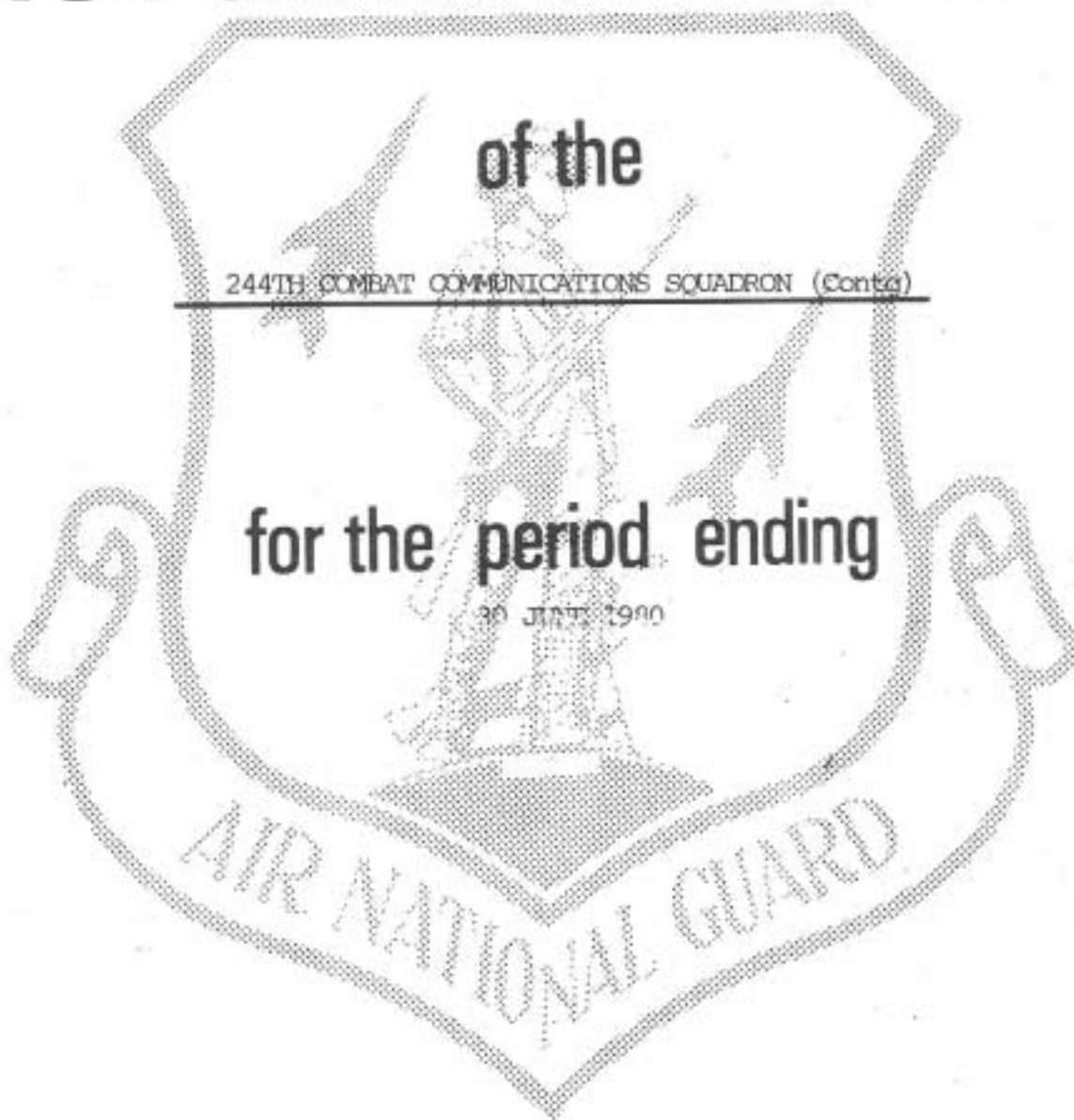

b. **Public Relations:** Airshow "80", the largest airshow in the history of Oregon was presented in the interest of the general public for the purpose of promoting civilian and military aviation. The show took place on 13-14 Sep 80 at Hillsboro Airport. There was over 120,000 people at the show during the weekend. Capt Lever of the Squadron coordinated concession booths for souvenirs at the show. SMS Norby, of the Sq, set up the Command Post for the show with all the necessary communications gear.

c. **Awards and Decorations:** A1C Douglas J. Moxley of the Squadron Operations Section was awarded the Honor Graduate Ribbon and Certificate upon his graduation from Basic Military Training. A copy of his congratulatory letter and ribbon certificate is attached.
