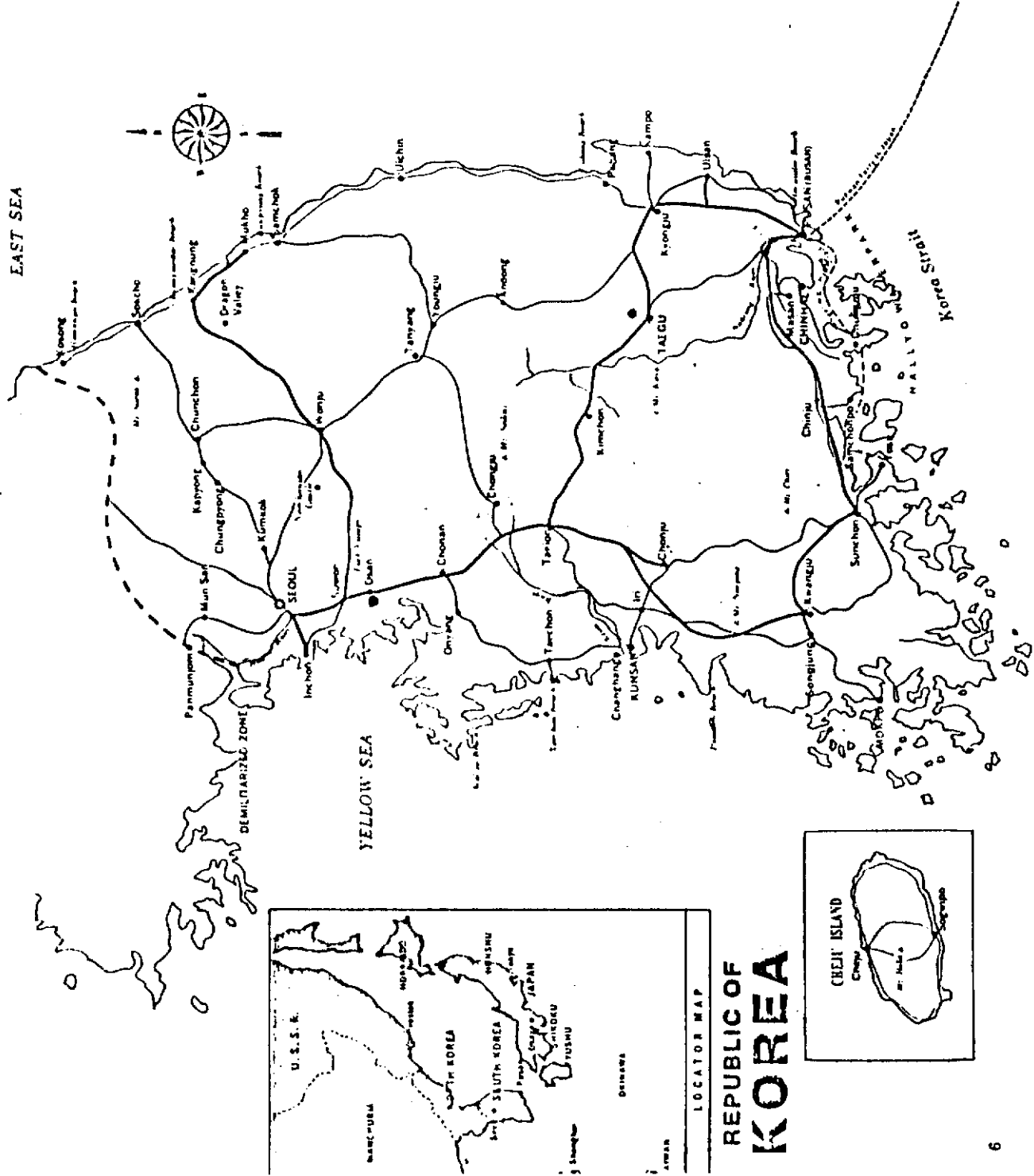


# **TEAM SPIRIT 87**

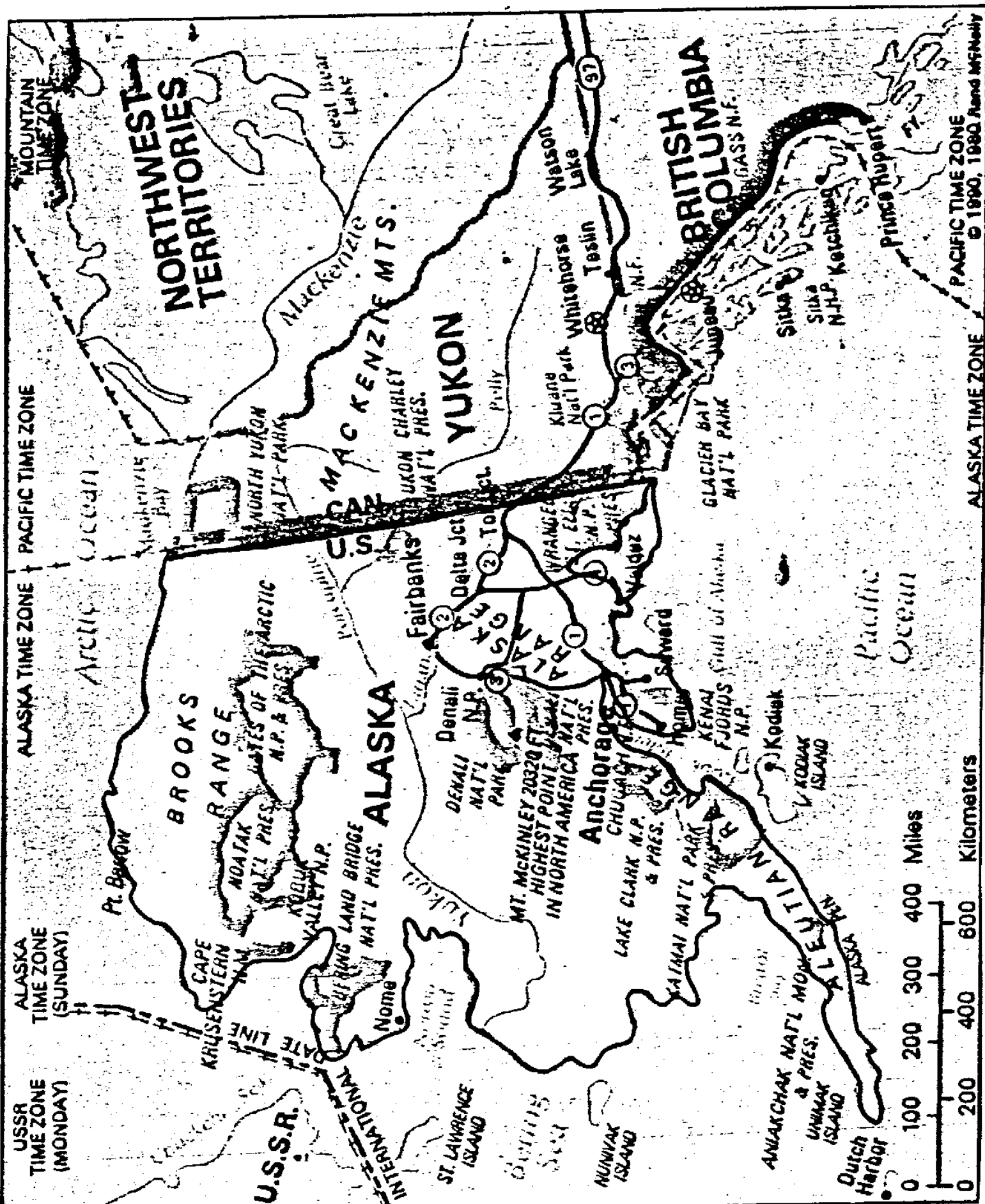
