

The 244th Combat communications Squadron's Squadron Logo has been changed from CCSQ to CBCS, Which also means Combat Communications Squadron.



Report for the fourth Quarter of 1994
OCTOBER-DECEMBER

The October 1-2 UTA was a 36 hour (modified) exercise. A command and control HF net was established to work with the 272CBCS, located at Camp Bonneville. A TSC-93B was used to enter the DCS gateway at Camp Roberts, CA. A second TSC-93B was utilized to communicate with the 272CBCS. Two TSSR's, one deployed to Camp Boneville and one in-garrison, was used to develop and alternate circuit between the 244th CBCS and deployed 272CBCS. This exercise provided an opportunity for remote multiplexer combiner (RMC) training, in conjunction with 407L cable utilization.

November 19-20 UTA - On 5-6 November, EC, Engineer, Radio Ops, COMSEC and DW members attended a 2 day Conference at Camp Murray, WA. Shots and Physicals were scheduled this UTA.
