The January UTA was dedicated to training for the upcoming ORI that transpired in July. Annual safety inspection for Operations, Maintenance Control, and Material Control was conducted. Weapons cleaning inspections, and arms vault procedure training were given by the SP. There was a 2 hour Quality assurance Section Planning Meeting. A dynel tent was erected in the Auditorium to simulate field conditions. The March drill was designated as a Commander's Option UTA. The main focus of the weekend was to prepare for our May 96hr. deployment and to complete final tune up for all UTC's. April UTA-This weekend was dedicated to a Mobility Exercise to help prepare the 244CBCS for our mission at the July '96 ORI. Training was conducted on palletizing, weighing and labeling UTC increments and Hazardous Cargo. All personnel went through a processing line to check all essentials before deployment. This was the month for weigh-ins, physicals and shots. Retirements for this month are: Russell L. Ainslie. Promotions for this month were: SrA. Jeffery W. Bynum, SrA. Brandon M. Hoard, and TSgt Kenneth Stillwell.

May was designated as a 96 hour deployment in support of 252CCGP Oplan 533. 3-4 May was the May UTA. 5-6 May was Our Annual field training. Our objective for this UTA was to conduct a command and control and circuit dress rehearsal for the ORI. Also practiced were CFP commandand control in all rated areas at a criteria of "Excellent" or higher and to achieve

employment circuit activation at a criteria of "Excellent" or higher. Unit members performed ATSO (Passive Defense Measures/Response and BRAAT).

Deployment was to Camp Rilea. Once on Camp Rilea the base was closed. The Convoys departed starting at 0900hrs. Friday 3 May 96 and arrived at Rilea at 1300hrs. S-hour started Sat 4 May 96 at 0800hrs. No camouflage was required for this deployment. Endex was Sun 5 May 96 at 1700hrs. 6 May was utilized for recovering equipment. Personnel were released upon approval of the Commander. Promotions for this month were: TSgt Judy J. Riley.

The 1-2 June UTA was intended for accomplishing a wide variety of training. Outbreifings were held for the ORI as final preparations were set in motion for our deployment.
