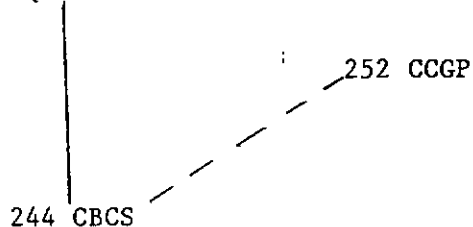

## HISTORY REPORT FOR JANUARY THRU DECEMBER 2001

### JANUARY 20-21 UTA \*

The January UTA Mission was train, maintain, and equip personnel for all taskings. There was section training, CRO training, A-bag inventory, CDC testing, PRF review, and Flu shots were given.

### FEBRUARY 03-04 UTA\*

The February UTA was utilized to install, operate, and maintain a satellite link with DSCS Wahiawa. Also, maintain, and operate a PSC-5 radio on the scheduled UHF TACSAT network. Sections not participating in the operational phase of this 36-hour in-garrison exercise will be undergoing section training and working normal shift hours.

### MARCH 17-18 UTA\*

The March UTA emphasis was placed on AFSC training. There was section training, ESD training, CDC testing, CFP workshop, Federal Hazcom training, and initial SATE training. The UCI was in March from the 15-20. Areas inspected were the following; Personnel, Communications and Information, Deployment Planning, War Reserve Material, Base Support Planning, and Geographically Separated Units/Collocated Supply Functions.

### APRIL 21-22 UTA\*

The April UTA emphasis was placed on AFSC training. There was uninterrupted section training, Immunizations were given, CDC testing, Individuals were available to assist with Electronic Personnel Security Questionnaire data input for security clearances, there was a CFP group meeting.

### MAY 05-06 UTA \*

JUNE 02-03 UTA \*

The June UTA was a 36-hour exercise. Install, operate, and maintain a satellite link with Reachback, Langley AFB, VA. Install, maintain, and operate a TRC-170 link with the 143<sup>rd</sup> CBCS. Install, maintain, and operate a PSC-5 radio on the schedule UHF TACSAT network. Sections not participating in the operational phase of this 36-hour in-garrison exercise will be undergoing section training.

JULY UTA There was no drill.

AUGUST 04-19 UTA\*

This time was designated for the 244 CBCS AFT. Conduct a unit Mobex. Conduct hands on training classes for STAMPS/TASDAC, TTC-39, FCC-100, TRC-170, TSSR, TSC-93B and CFP. Install, operate, and maintain a satellite link with Langley AFB. Install and operate a TRC-170/system between the 244CBCS and the 143CBCS. Install, operate, and maintain TTC-39A circuit switch and SB-3865 switchboards. Install, operate, and maintain STAMPS and TASDAC systems. Install, operate, and maintain a PSC-5 terminal operating in 5KHZ Satellite (Non-DAMA) voice mode.

SEPTEMBER 15-16 UTA\*

The September UTA was train, maintain, and equip personnel for all taskings.

OCTOBER 13-14 UTA\*

The October UTA emphasis was placed on AFSC training. There was section training, CDC testing, Immunizations, 2E2/2E6's COMSEC Awareness training, and CFETP Transcriptions class.
