Indisputably our favorite outdoor / indoor restaurant, the Tanereen in Fahaheel, Kuwait serves a unique salad dish. It is a salad of tomatoes, celery, carrots and other greens soaked in vinegar and topped with slices of brain. I believe it is lamb or goat. Too small to be camel brain I'm sure. The whole dish is then sprinkled with lemon juice. The texture of the brain is quite soft; not unlike TOFU for those of you who have tasted the Japanese dish. The brain is firm and holds well with a fork yet it tends to melt in your mouth. I did find it too lemony but otherwise, a tasty experience. I did find it far more appealing then the tongue dish being offered. For some reason, staring at a whole uncut tongue with its hair-like surface was actually less appetizing then the brain salad.
